Imja Glacier at risk

A study on Glacier Lake conducted by researchers from 13 different countries found that Imja glacier grew at an accelerated rate than other glaciers. The impact of climate change had been profoundly seen in Imja glacier and thus poses risk of bursting. The researchers said the burst of glaciers will affect upto 60 miles. Thus, senior scientists alleged for immediate action to be taken and if electricity is produced or new engineering applied then it would help to impede its bursting to some extent.
